The events last year:

Summer seminar 2017:

A fantastic Jodo seminar in Birmingham led by Hopson Sensei, Vitalis Sensei and Buxton Sensei that covered Seitei, Koryu and Tanjo in depth. The training was spirited and in excellent humour. 35 took part across the 3 days with people coming from many parts of Europe and South America.

Ojika Koryu seminar 2017:

A new event focusing on Koryu. An excellent first showing of 16 with a nice spread of grades. This event was added to the calendar at the initiative of Ojika dojo. It was coupled with an IT session which had to be reduced due to the new squad policy announced by laidobu in December 2016. A big thanks to Ojika dojo who donated the cost of the hall hire to the bu and provided a good income opportunity.

Darlington 2017:

Slightly lower attendance this year than last.

Tanjo & Refereeing Seminar 2017:
